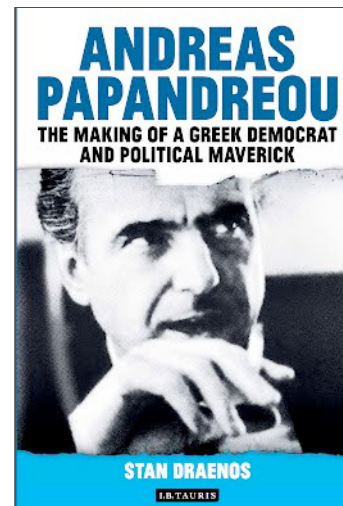

Andreas Papandreou: The making of a Greek democrat and political maverick.

During his formative years in Greek politics during the Sixties, Andreas Papandreou's forged the socially progressive nationalist politics that, after the dark interlude of military dictatorship, would sweep him to power in 1981. His ten subsequent years as prime minister would play a definitive role in realizing Greece's aspirations to emerge as a modern European democracy. Revisiting his political origins, Stan Draenos describes the high stakes and fierce struggles that gave birth to Papandreou's maverick politics and indicates the context they provide for making historical sense of the national emergency through which the country is now passing.
